Church Family,

It is a good and right thing for a church to want to grow. We don't want to be stagnant, and we certainly don't want to be declining. But how does one measure these things? Most would point to some numerical value tracked over time: attendance, membership, giving, baptisms, square footage of a building. If those numbers are tracking upward, then we are growing. Right?

Perhaps. There can be a correlation between increased numbers and genuine, biblical growth, but not always. Increased size does not always equate to faithfulness. Consider, for example, the church in Philadelphia, that Jesus addresses in Revelation 3:8 saying "I know that you have but little power, and you have kept my word and not denied my name." The church was not mighty according to the world's standards, yet Jesus commends them for remaining faithful to him and his word.

So what does Jesus desire in terms of the growth of his church? It is first of all to trust that Lord Jesus will build his church (Matt 16.18) according to his purposes, timing and plan and by his own power. Jesus has not called us to fabricate growth according to worldly standards, but to simply proclaim the word faithfully and look to God to bring the growth (1 Cor 3.7).

We also need to see that while building of the church is certainly the adding of new disciples to the congregation, it is also the spiritual growth of the existing congregation. We have seen this a great deal in Ephesians 4. The body is to build itself up in love, attaining to united faith centered around Jesus, to maturity and to Christlikeness.

So church, let us pray for growth in our church. But let's pray for the growth according to God's purposes. Let us pray that God will bring people into the kingdom through our proclamation of the Gospel. Let our prayer be that the growth of the church would be spiritual and according to the things of God, rather than just growth in the eyes of the world. And let us trust that what the Lord values is not an impressive building or a giant crowd. He values faithfulness to keep his word and to worship him.
